The Friends of the Yellow Barn Studio & Gallery is sponsoring an art competition for all high school sophomores, juniors and seniors from Montgomery County, Maryland, Northern Virginia, and Washington DC.

The Friends of the Yellow Barn will award a First Prize of \$500. \$25 gift certificates will be awarded to the other works selected for the exhibition.

Sophomore, Junior and senior art students in either public or private high schools may submit one piece for judging by Lenny Campello, renowned artist and curator in Washington DC.

Entries will be accepted in the Stone Tower, 2nd floor at Glen Echo Park, for judging on Saturday, March 11th from 10:00 AM to 3 PM. Students' works not accepted would be notified by e-mail that evening. These unaccepted works **must** be picked up on Sunday, March 12th from 12:00 to 4:00 PM. *The Friends of the Yellow Barn will not accept responsibility for any unaccepted work left after Sunday, March 12^h.*

Works selected for the exhibition will be returned the night of the reception following the award ceremony on Sunday, March 19th.

- ◆ Forty works will be selected for display. Each work submitted must be framed appropriately. If the work is matted, it must be under glass/plexiglass. **Do not submit wet paintings.**
- ◆ All work must be wired for hanging and labeled with the student's name, teachers' name, school, phone number, title of the work, medium and priced if for sale (NFS if not). **Work without wire will not be accepted.**
- ◆ If the student artist chooses to sell their work, the Yellow Barn Studio & Gallery will take a 35% commission to cover the cost of the exhibition, so price your work accordingly.
- ◆ All work must be from the artist's original ideas and only drawings and paintings will be accepted in any medium.
- ◆ Mixed media and prints can be included, (Photography, Sculpture, Computer or Xerox generated prints will not be accepted). There is no limit to size, and the Yellow Barn Studio & Gallery reserves the right to reject pieces deemed inappropriate.
- ◆ All forty artists selected for the exhibition will receive either a cash award or a \$25 gift certificate to be used at Plaza art stores in the area. Additional cash prizes of \$500, \$250, and \$150 will be announced for the top three award winners.
- ◆ A reception and awards ceremony for the artists will be held Sunday, March 19th from 4 to 5PM. Student works from the show, will be returned following the awards ceremony.
- ◆ **Students, whose artwork is selected for this exhibition, must be at the awards ceremony to receive their cash awards & gift certificates.**
